**The Chemicals (Health and Safety) Trade and  
Miscellaneous Amendments Regulations 2022**

*Made - - - - 10th October 2022*

*Coming into force - - 1st November 2022*

The Secretary of State makes the following Regulations, in exercise of powers conferred by section 2 of the Trade Act 2021<sup>(1)</sup>, by section 8(1) and 8C(1) of, and paragraph 7 of Schedule 4 to, the European Union (Withdrawal) Act 2018<sup>(2)</sup>, and by section 41(1) of the European Union (Withdrawal Agreement) Act 2020<sup>(3)</sup>.

In accordance with paragraph 4(1) of Schedule 2 to the Trade Act 2021, and paragraphs 1(1), 8F(1), 12(1) and 38(2)<sup>(4)</sup> of Schedule 7 to the European Union (Withdrawal) Act 2018, a draft of these Regulations has been laid before Parliament and approved by a resolution of each House of Parliament.
