## **CIVIL AVIATION**

# The Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Edinburgh) Regulations 2022

Made - - - - 31st October 2022

Coming into force - - 31st December 2022

The Secretary of State has decided that it is in the public interest to restrict the flying of unmanned aircraft in the area specified in regulation 3(1) by reason of the intended holding there of events associated with the New Year celebrations which will be attended by a large number of persons.

The Secretary of State makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by article 239 of the Air Navigation Order 2016(a).

#### Citation and commencement

**1.** These Regulations may be cited as the Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Edinburgh) Regulations 2022 and they come into force on 31st December 2022.

#### Interpretation

**2.** In regulation 3(1) the times referred to are Co-ordinated Universal Time(**b**).

## Restricted airspace

- **3.**—(1) Subject to paragraph (2), between 1700 hours on 31st December 2022 and 0300 hours on 1st January 2023 no unmanned aircraft is to fly below 1,500 feet above mean sea level within the area bounded by a circle having a radius of 1 nautical mile whose centre is at 555705N 0031106W.
- (2) Paragraph (1) does not apply to any unmanned aircraft operating in accordance with a permission issued by the Police Scotland Aviation Safety and Security Unit.

### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations impose restrictions on the flying of unmanned aircraft in the vicinity of Edinburgh for a number of events associated with the New Year celebrations which will be attended by a large number of persons. The Civil Aviation Authority and the Department for Transport agree that the flying of unmanned aircraft should be restricted in the vicinity of the events for reasons of public safety and security.

The times mentioned in regulation 3(1) are Co-ordinated Universal Time (UTC) which is the same as Greenwich Mean Time (GMT).
