The Blaby (Electoral Changes) Order 2022

Made - - - 16th December 2022 Coming into force in accordance with article 1(2) and (3)

Under section 58(4) of the Local Democracy, Economic Development and Construction Act 2009(1) ("the Act") the Local Government Boundary Commission for England(2)("the Commission") published a report dated July 2022(3) stating its recommendations for changes to the electoral arrangements for the district of Blaby. The Commission has decided to give effect to the recommendations.

A draft of the instrument has been laid before Parliament and a period of forty days has expired since the day on which it was laid and neither House has resolved that the instrument be not made.

The Commission makes the following Order in exercise of the power conferred by section 59(1) of the Act.

Citation, commencement, extent and application

- 1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Blaby (Electoral Changes) Order 2022.
- (2) This article and article 2 come into force on the day after the day on which this Order is made.
- (3) Articles 3 and 4 come into force—
 - (a) for the purpose of proceedings preliminary or relating to the election of councillors, on the day after the day on which this Order is made;
 - (b) for all other purposes, on the ordinary day of election of councillors in England(4) in 2023.
- (4) This Order extends to England and Wales but applies in relation to England only.

Interpretation

- **2.**—(1) In this Order, "the map" means the map marked "Map referred to in the Blaby (Electoral Changes) Order 2022", held by the Local Government Boundary Commission for England(5).
- (2) Where a boundary is shown on the map as running along a road, railway line, footway, watercourse or similar geographical feature, it is to be treated as running along the centre line of the feature.

Wards of the district of Blaby and number of councillors

- **3.**—(1) The existing wards of the district of Blaby are abolished.
- (2) The district of Blaby is divided into the 17 wards listed in the first column of the table in Schedule 1.
 - (3) Each ward comprises the area identified on the map by reference to the name of the ward.
- (4) The number of councillors to be elected for each ward is the number specified in relation to that ward in the second column of the table in Schedule 1.

Parish wards of the parishes of Blaby, Braunstone, Glenfield and Leicester Forest East, and number of parish councillors

- **4.**—(1) The existing parish wards of Blaby, Braunstone, Glenfield and Leicester Forest East are abolished.
- (2) The parish of Blaby is divided into the three parish wards listed in the first column of table 1 in Schedule 2.
- (3) The parish of Braunstone is divided into the four parish wards listed in the first column of table 2 in Schedule 2.
- (4) The parish of Glenfield is divided into the two parish wards listed in the first column of table 3 in Schedule 2.
- (5) The parish of Leicester Forest East is divided into the three parish wards listed in the first column of table 4 in Schedule 2.
- (6) Each parish ward comprises the area identified on the map by reference to the name of the parish ward.
- (7) The number of councillors to be elected for each parish ward is the number specified in relation to that parish ward in the second column of the relevant table in Schedule 2.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order)

This Order makes changes to electoral arrangements for the district of Blaby following recommendations made by the Local Government Boundary Commission for England. The area of the district remains unchanged.

Article 3 abolishes the existing electoral wards of the district of Blaby and replaces them with 17 new ones listed in Schedule 1 for the purpose of elections held on or after the ordinary day of election of councillors in England in 2023. It establishes the names and areas of the new electoral wards and the number of councillors for each.

Article 4 makes electoral changes in the parishes of Blaby, Braunstone, Glenfield and Leicester Forest East. These changes to parish wards come into force for the purpose of parish elections in

2023. Article 4 gives effect to Schedule 2 which contains the names and number of councillors for the new parish wards.
