Amendment of the National Health Service Commissioning Board and Clinical Commissioning Groups (Responsibilities and Standing Rules) Regulations 2012

- **2.**—(1) The National Health Service Commissioning Board and Clinical Commissioning Groups (Responsibilities and Standing Rules) Regulations 2012(1) are amended as follows.
 - (2) In regulation 20 (interpretation)—
 - (a) in the definition of "flat rate payment", for "£209.19" substitute "£219.71"; and
 - (b) in the definition of "high band payment", for "£287.78" substitute "£302.25".

Under section 1 of the Health and Care Act 2022, the NHS Commissioning Board was renamed NHS England. On 1 July 2022, in accordance with Chapter A3 of Part 2 of the National Health Service Act 2006 (as inserted by section 19 of the Health and Care Act 2022) and S.I. 2022/632, NHS England established integrated care boards to take on the commissioning functions of clinical commissioning groups. As a consequence of those changes, paragraph 1(1) of the Schedule to S.I. 2022/634 substitutes references to "clinical commissioning group" with "integrated care board" in the Standing Rules. In addition, in accordance with paragraph 1(3) of Schedule 1 to the Health and Care Act 2022, the references to the "NHS Commissioning Board" in the Standing Rules are to be read, in relation to any time on or after 1 July 2022, as a reference to "NHS England".
