The Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Scarborough Armed Forces Day) Regulations 2024

Made - - - - *14th March 2024*

Coming into force - - *29th June 2024*

The Secretary of State has decided that it is necessary in the public interest to restrict flying in the area specified in regulation 3(1) by reason of the intended holding of flying displays that are scheduled to take place there.

The Secretary of State makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by article 239 of the Air Navigation Order 2016(a).

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Scarborough Armed Forces Day) Regulations 2024 and they come into force on 29th June 2024.

Interpretation

2. In regulation 3(2) the times referred to are Co-ordinated Universal Time(b).

Restricted airspace

3.—(1) Subject to paragraph (2), between 0930 hours and 1630 hours on 29th June 2024 no aircraft is to fly below 8,000 feet above mean sea level within the area bounded by a circle having a radius of 3.5 nautical miles whose centre is at 541642N 0002300W.

(2) Paragraph (1) does not apply to any aircraft—

(a) operated by or on behalf of the—

(i) National Police Air Service,

(ii) Helicopter Emergency Medical Services, or

(iii) Maritime and Coastguard Agency, or

(b) flying with the permission of the Scarborough Armed Forces Day flying display director.

(a) S.I. 2016/765, to which there are amendments not relevant to these Regulations.

(b) Co-ordinated Universal Time (UTC) is one hour behind British Summer Time (BST).

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations impose restrictions on flying in the vicinity of Scarborough, North Yorkshire, during flying displays for national Armed Forces Day that are scheduled to take place there on 29th June 2024.

Many aircraft will be involved in high energy manoeuvres during the displays and therefore the Civil Aviation Authority and the Department for Transport agree that flying should be restricted in the vicinity of the event for reasons of public safety.

The times mentioned in regulation 3(1) are Co-ordinated Universal Time (UTC) which is one hour behind British Summer Time (BST).

In relation to the permission mentioned in regulation 3(2)(b), the Scarborough Armed Forces Day flying display director may be contacted as notified.

Full details of this Statutory Instrument will be promulgated by Aeronautical Information Circular (AIC) and Notice to Aviation (NOTAM).
