(iv) Form of Coroner's Return as to Deaths(a)

FORM OF CORONER'S RETURN AS TO DEATHS CAUSED BY RAILWAY ACCIDENTS PRESCRIBED BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE.

Return of Death of Person killed on a Railway or dying from Injuries received on a Railway.

Railway Regulation Act, 1873, s. 5. (36 & 37 Vict. c. 76).

The above Act requires every coroner, within seven days after the holding of an inquest on the body of any person who is proved to

have been killed on a railway, or to have died in consequence of injuries received on a railway, to make to the Secretary of State, in such form as he may require, a return of the death and of the cause thereof. The following is the form prescribed by the Secretary of State:—

- 1. Name of railway (stating whether—
 - (1) open for public traffic;
 - (2) in course of construction;
 - (3) belonging to private owners).
- 2. Place where accident occurred
- 3. Date of accident
- 4. Date of inquest
- 5. Place where inquest was held
- 6. Name of person killed or fatally injured
- 7. Whether killed on the railway, or dying in consequence of injuries received on the railway
- 8. Whether-
 - (1) Servant—
 - (a) of Company (stating class of service).
 - (b) of contractor

(giving name and address of contractor).

- (2) Passenger
- (3) Person crossing at public or private level crossing (specifying which)
- (4) Trespasser
- (5) Person on business at stations or sidings
- (6) Other persons
- 9. Copy of verdict at inquest
- 10. Remarks
