Mae Rhan III o Ddeddf Llywodraeth Leol 2000 ("y Ddeddf") yn sefydlu fframwaith moesegol newydd ar gyfer llywodraeth leol yng Nghymru.

Mae adran 49(2) o'r Ddeddf yn darparu y caiff Cynulliad Cenedlaethol Cymru, drwy orchymyn, bennu'r egwyddorion sydd i lywodraethu ymddygiad aelodau ac aelodau cyfetholedig awdurdodau perthnasol (a ddiffinnir yn Erthygl 2 o'r Gorchymyn hwn) yng Nghymru.

Mae awdurdodau o'r fath yn cynnwys (ymhlith eraill) cyngorau sir, cyngorau bwrdeistref sirol a chyngorau cymuned, ond nid ydynt yn cynnwys awdurdodau heddlu.

Mae'r Gorchymyn hwn yn pennu'r egwyddorion perthnasol.

The Conduct of Members
(Principles) (Wales) Order 2001

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note does not form part of the Order)

Part III of the Local Government Act 2000 ("the Act") establishes a new ethical framework for local government in Wales.

Section 49(2) of the Act provides that the National Assembly for Wales may by order specify the principles which are to govern the conduct of members and co-opted members of relevant authorities (defined in Article 2 of this Order) in Wales.

Such authorities include (amongst others) county councils, county borough councils and community councils, but do not include police authorities.

This Order specifies the relevant principles.

Dehongli

2. Yn y Gorchymyn hwn -

mae "aelod" ("member") yn cynnwys aelod cyfetholedig;

ystyr "aelod cyfetholedig" ("co-opted member"), mewn perthynas ag awdurdod perthnasol, yw person nad yw'n aelod o'r awdurdod hwnnw ond sydd -

- (a) yn aelod o unrhyw un o bwyllgorau neu is-bwyllgorau'r awdurdod, neu
- (b) yn aelod o unrhyw un o gyd-bwyllgorau neu o gyd-is-bwyllgorau'r awdurdod ac yn cynrychioli'r awdurdod arno,

ac y mae ganddo hawl i bleidleisio ar unrhyw gwestiwn sydd i'w benderfynu yn unrhyw un o gyfarfodydd y pwylgor neu'r is-bwyllgor hwnnw; ac

ystyr "awdurdod perthnasol" ("relevant authority") yw -

- (a) cyngor sir,
- (b) cyngor bwrdeistref sirol,
- (c) cyngor cymuned,

The National Assembly for Wales makes the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by sections 49(2) and 105(1) of the Local Government Act 2000(a).

Citation, commencement and application

1.-(1) This Order may be cited as the Conduct of Members (Principles) (Wales) Order 2001 and shall come into force on 28 July 2001.

(2) This Order applies to each relevant authority in Wales.

Interpretation

2. In this Order -

"co-opted member" ("aelod cyfetholedig"), in relation to a relevant authority, means a person who is not a member of the authority but who-

- (a) is a member of any committee or sub-committee of the authority, or
- (b) is a member of, and represents the authority on, any joint committee or joint sub-committee of the authority,

and who is entitled to vote on any question which falls to be decided at any meeting of that committee or sub-committee;

"member" ("aelod") includes a co-opted member; and

"relevant authority" ("awdurdod perthnasol") means -

- (a) a county council,
- (b) a county borough council,
- (c) a community council,

- (e) a National Park authority established under section 63 of the Environment Act 1995(b).

Anhunanoldeb

- Rhaid iaelodau weithredu er lles y cyhoedd yn unig. Rhaid iddynt beidio byth â defnyddio'u safle fel aelodau er mantais amhriodol iddynt eu hunain neu er mantais neu anfantais amhriodol i eraill.

Gonestrwydd

- Rhaid iaelodau ddatgan unrhyw buddiannau preifat sy'n berthnasol i'w dyletswyddau cyhoeddus a chymryd camau i ddatrys unrhyw wrthdaro mewn modd sy'n diogelu buddiannau'r cyhoedd.

Uniondeb a Gwedduster

- Rhaid iaelodau beidio â'u rhoi eu hunain mewn sefyllfa lle mae unrhyw rwymedigaeth ariannol neu rwymedigaeth arall tuag at unigolion neu gyrrff a allai geisio dylanwadu arnynt wrth iddynt gyflawni eu dyletswyddau yn bwrw amheuaeth ar eu huniondeb. Rhaid iaelodau osgoi ymddygiad sy'n ymddangos felly bob adeg.

Dyletswydd i Gynnal y Gyfraith

- Rhaid iaelodau weithredu i gynnal y gyfraith, a gweithredu bob amser yn unol â'r ymddiriedaeth y mae'r cyhoedd wedi'i rhoi iddynt.

Stiwardiaeth

- Wrth gyflawni eu dyletswyddau a'u cyfrifoldebau rhaid iaelodau sicrhau bod adnoddau'r awdurdod yn cael eu defnyddio'n gyfreithlon ac yn ddoeth.

Gwrthrychedd wrth wneud Penderfyniadau

- Wrth gyflawni eu cyfrifoldebau, gan gynnwys gwneud penodiadau, dyfarnu contractau, neu argymhell unigolion ar gyfer gwobrwyon a manteision, rhaid iaelodau wneud penderfyniadau ar sail rhagoriaeth. Er bod rhaid iaelodau roi sylw i gyngor proffesiynol swyddogion a gall fod yn briodol iddynt roi sylw i farn eraill, gan gynnwys eu grwpiau gwleidyddol, eu cyfrifoldeb hwy yw penderfynu pa safbwyt i'w arddel ac, os yw'n briodol, sut i bleidleisio ar unrhyw fater.

Cydraddoldeb a Pharch

- Rhaid iaelodau gyflawni eu dyletswyddau a'u cyfrifoldebau gyda sylw dyladwy i'r angen i hybu cyfartal i bawb, ni waeth beth yw eu gender, eu hil, eu hanabedd, eu

SCHEDULE

Article 3

THE PRINCIPLES

Selflessness

- Members must act solely in the public interest. They must never use their position as members to improperly confer advantage on themselves or to improperly confer advantage or disadvantage on others.

Honesty

- Members must declare any private interests relevant to their public duties and take steps to resolve any conflict in a way that protects the public interest.

Integrity and Propriety

- Members must not put themselves in a position where their integrity is called into question by any financial or other obligation to individuals or organisations that might seek to influence them in the performance of their duties. Members must on all occasions avoid the appearance of such behaviour.

Duty to Uphold the Law

- Members must act to uphold the law and act on all occasions in accordance with the trust that the public has placed in them.

Stewardship

- In discharging their duties and responsibilities members must ensure that their authority's resources are used both lawfully and prudently.

Objectivity in Decision-making

- In carrying out their responsibilities including making appointments, awarding contracts, or recommending individuals for rewards and benefits, members must make decisions on merit. Whilst members must have regard to the professional advice of officers and may properly take account of the views of others, including their political groups, it is their responsibility to decide what view to take and, if appropriate, how to vote on any issue.

Equality and Respect

- Members must carry out their duties and responsibilities with due regard to the need to promote equality of opportunity for all people, regardless of their gender, race, disability,

Bod yn Agored

8. Rhaid i aelodau fod mor agored â phosibl ynghylch eu holl weithredoedd a gweithredoedd eu hawdurdod. Rhaid iddynt geisio sicrhau bod datgeliadau gwybodaeth yn cael eu cyfyngu yn unol â'r gyfraith yn unig.

Atebolrwydd

9. Mae'r aelodau'n atebol i'r etholwyr ac i'r cyhoedd yn gyffredinol am eu gweithredoedd ac am sut y maent yn cyflawni eu cyfrifoldebau fel aelod. Rhaid iddynt fod yn barod i ildio i unrhyw archwiliadau sy'n briodol ar gyfer eu cyfrifoldebau.

Rhoi Arweiniad

10. Rhaid i aelodau hybu a chefnogi'r egwyddorion hyn drwy roi arweiniad ac esiampl fel y byddant yn hybu hyder cyhoeddus yn eu rôl ac yn yr awdurdod. Rhaid iddynt barchu didueddwch ac uniondeb swyddogion statudol yr awdurdod a chyflogion eraill yr awdurdod.

Openness

8. Members must be as open as possible about all their actions and those of their authority. They must seek to ensure that disclosure of information is restricted only in accordance with the law.

Accountability

9. Members are accountable to the electorate and the public generally for their actions and for the way they carry out their responsibilities as a member. They must be prepared to submit themselves to such scrutiny as is appropriate to their responsibilities.

Leadership

10. Members must promote and support these principles by leadership and example so as to promote public confidence in their role and in the authority. They must respect the impartiality and integrity of the authority's statutory officers and its other employees.

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
