**The A55 Trunk Road (Broughton,
Flintshire) (Temporary Prohibition
of Vehicles, Cyclists & Pedestrians)
Order 2014**

Coming into force

13 July 2014

The Welsh Ministers, being the traffic authority for the relevant length of the Chester – Bangor Trunk Road (A55) (hereinafter referred to as “the trunk road”), are satisfied that traffic in a specified length of the trunk road should be prohibited by reason of works proposed to be executed thereon or near to.

The Welsh Ministers, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 14(1) and (4) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(1) and of all other enabling powers(2), make this Order.

Title, Interpretation and Commencement

1. This Order comes into force on 13 July 2014 and its title is The A55 Trunk Road (Broughton, Flintshire) (Temporary Prohibition of Vehicles, Cyclists & Pedestrians) Order 2014.

2. —(1) In this Order:

“the length of the trunk road” (“*y darn o’r gefnffordd*”) means the entire length of the trunk road known as Broughton link road in the County of Flintshire that extends from its junction with Broughton Retail Park Roundabout to its junction with the A5104 Broughton Roundabout;

“works period” (“*cyfnod y gwaith*”) means that period commencing at 00:01 hours on 13 July 2014 and ending when the temporary traffic signs are permanently removed.

(2) Any reference in this Order to a numbered article is a reference to the article bearing that number in this Order.

Prohibitions

3. Subject to the provisions of article 6, no person shall, during the works period, drive or cause or permit any vehicle to proceed in the length of the trunk road.

4. Subject to the provisions of article 6, no person shall, during the works period, ride or cause to be ridden, any pedal cycle in the length of the trunk road.

5. Subject to the provisions of article 6, no pedestrian shall, during the works period, proceed in the length of the trunk road.

Application

6. The provisions of articles 3, 4 and 5 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as the application of the prohibitions referred to therein is indicated by traffic signs.

Duration of this Order

7. The maximum duration of this Order shall be 12 months.
