

**2018 No. 919 (W. 181)**

**ROAD TRAFFIC, WALES**

**The A487 Trunk Road (Pentood,  
south of Cardigan, Ceredigion)  
(Temporary 30 mph Speed Limit &  
No Overtaking) Order 2018**

*Made* 30 July 2018

*Coming into force* 2 August 2018

The Welsh Ministers, as traffic authority for the A487 Trunk Road, are satisfied that traffic on a specified length of the trunk road should be restricted and/or prohibited because of the likelihood of a danger to the public on or near the road.

The Welsh Ministers, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 14(1), (4) and (7) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984<sup>(1)</sup>, make this Order.

**Title, Commencement and Interpretation**

1. The title of this Order is the A487 Trunk Road (Pentood, south of Cardigan, Ceredigion) (Temporary 30 mph Speed Limit & No Overtaking) Order 2018 and it comes into force on 2 August 2018.

2. In this Order:

“exempted vehicle” (“*cerbyd esempt*”) means:

- (a) any vehicle being used for the purposes described in section 87 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984<sup>(2)</sup>; and

(2) Section 87 was amended by the Fire and Rescue Services Act 2004 (c.21), Schedule 1, paragraph 55, the Serious Organised Crime and Police Act 2005 (c.15), Schedule 4, paragraph 42, the Crime and Courts Act 2013 (c.22), Schedule 8, paragraph 29(2) and the Deregulation Act 2015 (c.20), section 50(4) and (5).

(b) any vehicle being used for naval, military or air force purposes and being driven by a person for the time being subject to the orders of a member of the armed forces of the Crown, who is a member of the special forces—

(i) in response, or for practice in responding, to a national security emergency by a person who has been trained in driving at high speeds; or

(ii) for the purpose of training a person in driving vehicles at high speeds;

“restricted period” (“*cyfnod y cyfyngiad*”) means the period commencing at 09:00 hours on 2 August 2018 and ending when the temporary traffic signs are permanently removed;

“special forces” (“*lluoedd arbennig*”) means those units of the armed forces the maintenance of whose capabilities is the responsibility of the Director of Special Forces or which are for the time being subject to the operational command of that Director;

“the trunk road” (“*y gefnffordd*”) means the A487 Fishguard to Bangor trunk road at Pentood, south of Cardigan in the County of Ceredigion that extends from a point 800 metres west of the centre-point of its junction with Longdown Street to a point 400 metres east of the centre-point of that junction.

### **Restriction and Prohibition**

3. No person may, during the restricted period, drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 30 miles per hour on the length of the trunk road.

4. No person may, during the restricted period, use or permit the use of a vehicle, other than an exempted vehicle, in such a way that it overtakes any other vehicle on the length of the trunk road.

### **Application**

5.—(1) The restriction and prohibition in articles 3 and 4 apply only during such times and to such extent as indicated by traffic signs.

(2) No speed limit imposed by this Order applies to an exempted vehicle.

### **Suspension**

6. Any statutory provisions restricting the speed of vehicles on the length of the trunk road specified in article 2 are suspended during such times as the restriction specified in article 3 is in operation.

**Duration of this Order**

7. The maximum duration of this Order is 6 months.
