**The A487 Trunk Road (Bow Street,
Ceredigion) (Part-time 20 mph
Speed Limit) Order 2018**

Made 31 July 2018

Coming into force 3 August 2018

The Welsh Ministers, as traffic authority for the A487 Trunk Road, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 84(1)(c), (1A) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984⁽¹⁾ and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Dyfed-Powys Police, make this Order.

Title, Commencement and Interpretation

1. The title of this Order is the A487 Trunk Road (Bow Street, Ceredigion) (Part-time 20 mph Speed Limit) Order 2018 and it comes into force on 3 August 2018.

2. In this Order:

“exempted vehicle” (*“cerbyd esempt”*) means:

- (a) any vehicle being used for the purposes described in section 87 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984⁽²⁾;
- (b) any vehicle being used for naval, military or air force purposes and being driven by a person for the time being subject to the orders of a member of the armed forces of the

Crown, who is a member of the special forces—

- (i) in response, or for practice in responding, to a national security emergency by a person who has been trained in driving at high speeds; or
- (ii) for the purpose of training a person in driving vehicles at high speeds;

“special forces” (*“lluoedd arbennig”*) means those units of the armed forces the maintenance of whose capabilities is the responsibility of the Director of Special Forces or which are for the time being subject to the operational command of that Director; and

“the trunk road” (*“y gefnffordd”*) means the A487 Fishguard to Bangor Trunk Road.

Restriction

3. No person may drive any motor vehicle, other than an exempted vehicle, at a speed exceeding 20 miles per hour on the length of the trunk road at Bow Street, Ceredigion that extends from a point 16 metres north of the centre-point of its junction with Maes Ceiro to a point 173 metres north of the centre-point of its junction with Caer Odyn.

Application

4. The restriction in article 3 applies only during such times and to such extent as indicated by traffic signs.
