### LOCAL GOVERNMENT, WALES

The County of Pembrokeshire (Electoral Arrangements) Order 2021

Made - - - 25 October 2021 Coming into force in accordance with article 1(2) and (3)

The Local Democracy and Boundary Commission for Wales(1) has, in accordance with section 36(5) of the Local Government (Democracy) (Wales) Act 2013(2) ("the 2013 Act"), submitted to the Welsh Ministers a report dated July 2019 containing its recommendations for change and the details of its review of the electoral arrangements for the County of Pembrokeshire.

The Welsh Ministers have, after consideration of the matters referred to and set out in section 37(2) (a) and (c) of the 2013 Act, decided to give effect to those recommendations with modifications.

In accordance with section 37(3) of the 2013 Act, more than 6 weeks have elapsed since those recommendations were submitted to the Welsh Ministers.

The Welsh Ministers make the following Order in exercise of their powers conferred by section 37(1) of the 2013 Act.

### Title and commencement

- **1.**—(1) The title of this Order is the County of Pembrokeshire (Electoral Arrangements) Order 2021.
- (2) For any purpose set out in regulation 4(1) of the Regulations, this Order comes into force on the second day after the day on which it is made.
- (3) For all other purposes, this Order comes into force on the ordinary day of election of councillors in 2022(3).

### Interpretation

### 2. In this Order—

"electoral ward" ("ward etholiadol") means any area for which members are elected to Pembrokeshire County Council;

"the Regulations" ("*y Rheoliadau*") means the Local Government Area Changes Regulations 1976(4);

any reference to a map means one of the 10 maps marked "Map of the County of Pembrokeshire (Electoral Arrangements) Order 2021" deposited in accordance with regulation 5 of the Regulations, labelled "1" to "10", and a reference to a numbered map is a reference to the map that bears that number;

where a boundary is shown on a map as running along a road, railway line, footway, watercourse or similar geographical feature, it is to be treated as running along the centre line of the feature;

words and expressions used in this Order have the same meaning as they have in Part 3 of the Local Government (Democracy) (Wales) Act 2013, except so far as a contrary intention appears.

### Electoral arrangements for the County of Pembrokeshire

- **3.**—(1) The electoral wards of the County of Pembrokeshire, as they exist immediately before the ordinary day of election of councillors in 2022, are abolished.
- (2) The County of Pembrokeshire is divided into 59 electoral wards each bearing the English language name listed in column 1 and the Welsh language name listed in column 2 of the Table in the Schedule to this Order.
- (3) Each electoral ward comprises the areas specified in relation to that electoral ward in column 3 of the Table in the Schedule to this Order.
- (4) The number of members of the council to be elected for each electoral ward is the number specified in column 4 of the Table in the Schedule to this Order.
- (5) The provisions in this Order take precedence over any conflicting provision in any previous statutory instrument made under section 58(2) of the Local Government Act 1972(5).

### The community of Milford Haven: changes to community wards

- 4. In the community of Milford Haven—
  - (a) the part of the Hakin ward shown hatched on Map 1 is transferred to the Central ward;
  - (b) the part of the Hubberston ward shown hatched on Map 2 is transferred to the Hakin ward;
  - (c) the part of the North ward shown hatched on Map 3 is transferred to the East ward.

### The community of Pembroke: changes to community wards

**5.** The part of the community ward of St Michael of the community of Pembroke shown hatched on Map 4 is transferred to the community ward of St Mary South of the community of Pembroke.

### The community of Pembroke: consequential changes to electoral arrangements

- **6.** In the community of Pembroke—
  - (a) the number of members to be elected for the St Mary South ward is 4;
  - (b) the number of members to be elected for the St Michael ward is 4.

### The community of Pembroke Dock: abolition of the community wards of Central and Llanion and creation of the community wards of Central and Bush

- 7.—(1) The community wards of Central and Llanion of the community of Pembroke Dock, as they exist immediately before the ordinary day of election of councillors in 2022, are abolished.
  - (2) There are constituted the following community wards—
    - (a) the Central ward shown hatched on Map 5;
    - (b) the Bush ward shown hatched on Map 6.

## The community of Pembroke Dock: abolition of the community ward of Pennar and creation of the community wards of Pennar and Bufferland

- **8.**—(1) The community ward of Pennar of the community of Pembroke Dock, as it exists immediately before the ordinary day of election of councillors in 2022, is abolished.
  - (2) There are constituted the following community wards—
    - (a) the Pennar ward shown hatched on Map 7;
    - (b) the Bufferland ward shown hatched on Map 8.

### The community of Pembroke Dock: consequential changes to electoral arrangements

- 9. In the community of Pembroke Dock—
  - (a) the number of members to be elected for the Bufferland ward is 3;
  - (b) the number of members to be elected for the Bush ward is 3;
  - (c) the number of members to be elected for the Central ward is 4;
  - (d) the number of members to be elected for the Pennar ward is 3.

#### The community of Saundersfoot: creation of community wards

- 10. The community of Saundersfoot is to be divided into the following community wards—
  - (a) the Saundersfoot North ward shown hatched on Map 9;
  - (b) the Saundersfoot South ward shown hatched on Map 10.

#### The community of Saundersfoot: consequential changes to electoral arrangements

- 11. In the community of Saundersfoot—
  - (a) the number of members to be elected for the Saundersfoot North ward is 4;
  - (b) the number of members to be elected for the Saundersfoot South ward is 8.

### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

(This note is not part of the Order)

This Order implements the recommendations of the Local Democracy and Boundary Commission for Wales ("the Commission"), which reported in July 2019 on its review of the electoral arrangements for the County of Pembrokeshire. The Commission's Report proposed a reduction in the number of electoral wards from 60 to 59, but recommended the number of councillors to remain at 60.

This Order implements the Commission's recommendations, with modifications.

Article 3 of this Order abolishes the existing electoral arrangements for the County of Pembrokeshire and introduces the Schedule, which sets out the new electoral arrangements for the County of Pembrokeshire.

This Order also implements recommendations for changes to the electoral arrangements for some communities within the County of Pembrokeshire.

Article 4 makes changes to the boundaries between the community wards of Hakin, Hubberston, Central, North and East within the community of Milford Haven.

Articles 5 and 6 make changes to the boundary between the community wards of St Michael and St Mary South within the community of Pembroke, and to the number of members to be elected for these wards.

Status: This is the original version (as it was originally made). This item of legislation is currently only available in its original format.

Article 7 abolishes the community wards of Central and Llanion within the community of Pembroke Dock, and creates the new community wards of Central and Bush.

Article 8 abolishes the community ward of Pennar within the community of Pembroke Dock, and creates the new community wards of Pennar and Bufferland.

Article 9 set outs the number of members to be elected for the new wards of Bufferland, Bush and Pennar in the community of Pembroke Dock, and makes changes to the number of members to be elected for the Central ward.

Article 10 creates the new community wards of Saundersfoot North and Saundersfoot South in the community of Saundersfoot. Article 11 sets out the number of members to be elected for these new wards.

The Welsh Ministers' Code of Practice on the carrying out of Regulatory Impact Assessments was considered in relation to this Order. As a result, it was not considered necessary to carry out a regulatory impact assessment as to the likely costs and benefits of complying with this Order.
