23 Clerk of Parliament to return to Treasury or to commissioners an account of fines set in the House of Lords;

- 24 and pay fines received as Treasury shall direct.
- 25 Clerk of House of Commons to make return of all recognizances.
- 26 Account of fines in King's Bench, Common Pleas, and Exchequer to be transmitted to Treasury and to commissioners of audit.
- 27 Unpaid fines to be estreated.
- 28 Fines, &c. received to be paid as Treasury shall direct.
- 29
- 30 Where fines, &c. are now estreated upon oath, such oath may be taken before a judge, &c.
- 31 Accounts of estreats to be transmitted to Treasury and to commissioners of audit.
- 32 Process to be issued every term, or oftener, to levy estreats.
- 33 Power to Treasury to stay process, and discharge the fines, &c.
